Responding To Face-to-face Bullying scenario:

Responding To Cyber Bullying scenario:



You receive a message on Facebook from someone at work. The message says: "You should talk to Elizabeth at work. She said she likes you and wants you to ask her out." You do not know Elizabeth very well and you think that person is trying to set you up to get you in trouble.

Responding To Cyber Bullying scenario:



You are Facebook "friends" with several people from work. One guy posts a sexually explicit image on your wall, and writes that it is you in the picture (even though it is not you). It makes you feel really upset and uncomfortable.

Responding To Harassment scenario:



Kara is an employee. One of her co-workers has started flirting with her at work. She has tried to make it clear that she is not interested in him. Now he has started sending her sexually suggestive emails and texts. These messages say things like, "Wanna' come over tonight?" and "You are so hot."

What should Kara do?

Responding To Harassment scenario:



Eric is an employee with ASD. Some of Eric's co-workers know that he has ASD and they always show him kindness and respect. However, one of his co-workers teases Eric and calls him terrible names such as "Rainman."

What should Eric do?



Responding To Harassment scenario:



Shawn is an employee. One of his co-workers believes that Shawn is homosexual. This co-worker has started calling him names and making lewd gestures behind Shawn's back.

What should Shawn do?

Responding To Harassment scenario:



Devon is an employee with autism. One of his co-workers has noticed that Devon sometimes says things in a monotone voice and makes facial expressions that are different. This co-worker has started impersonating Devon. In other words, he has started pretending to be Devon by copying Devon's gestures and facial expressions.

What should Devon do?
